

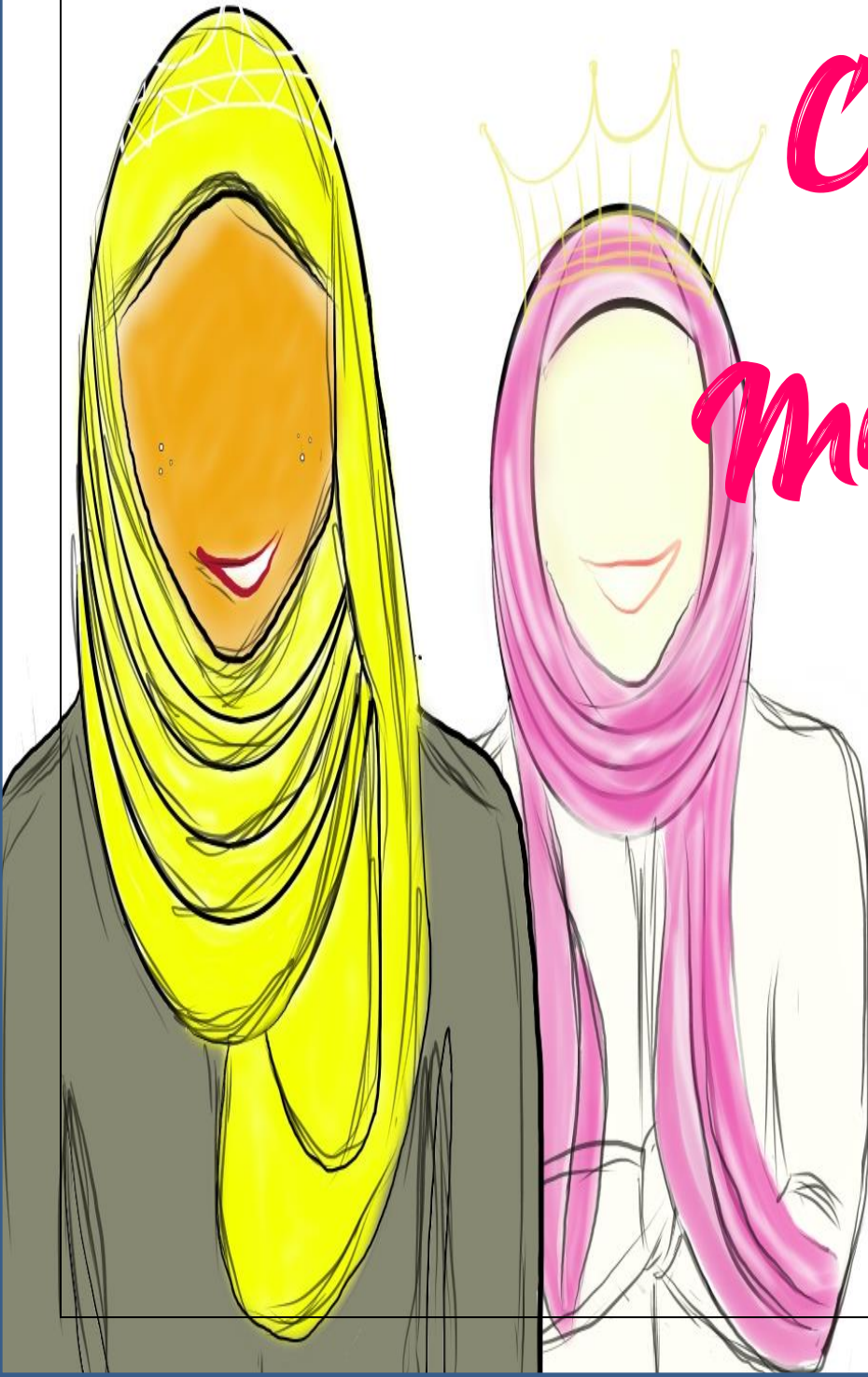

Be Proud to be a Woman

- A woman has the power to influence men, society.
- Islam allows her to earn, but hasn't obliged it on her!
- Islam laid that women should be honoured as wives and as mothers, and made the mother's rights three times greater than those of the father.
- Paradise is under the feet of the mother.
- A man's sins would be forgiven if he nurtures his sister or daughter.

Daughter

Rights of a daughter:

- To receive as much rights as the son.
- Right to be financially supported.
- To receive love and best maintenance.
- Right to inheritance.
- Right to choose her husband.
- A daughter always belongs to the paternal family.
- To be supported financially (if widowed or divorced) and looked after with love and affection.

Responsibilities of a daughter:

- Respect & Obedience.
- Be careful with words and deeds.
- Do not talk back.
- Do not be rude or loud.
- Do not say “Uff” or words of similar nature.
- Be mindful of family respect and dignity.
- Deal with your parents with 'Ehsaan'.
- Try to fulfill their requests and wishes to the best possible extent.
- Always be ready for their service.
- Communicate clearly, honestly and respectfully.
- Try your best to take care of your family.
- Take utmost care to cover yourself properly and to be in limits in matters of Non-Mahrams, in person or on social media.

♥TIPS

♥ Constant reminder of the Dua "**Rabbir humhuma kamaa Rabbayani Sagheera**".

♥ Give the seat to them and stand yourselves, if needed.

♥ Always carry their load.

♥ Make a habit of making dua for your parents daily. You can fix a time so that you don't miss it any day. Mentioned below are a few duas for parents from the Quran.

Dua 1

رَبِّ أَرْحَمْهُمَا كَمَا رَبَّيَانِي صَغِيرًا (٢٤)

My Lord! Be merciful to them as they have brought me up in my childhood. (Surah Isra: 24)

Dua 2

إِنَّ رَبِّي لَسَمِيعُ الدُّعَاءِ (٣٩) رَبِّ اجْعَلْنِي مُقِيمَ الصَّلَاةِ وَمِنْ ذُرِّيَّتِي رَبَّنَا وَتَقَبَّلْ دُعَاءِ (٤٠)

Verily my Lord is the Hearer of supplication. (39) My Lord! make me establisher of prayer and also from my progeny, our Lord! and accept my supplication. (40) (Surah Ibrahim:39 – 40)

Dua 3

يَغْفِرُ اللَّهُ لَكُمْ وَهُوَ أَرْحَمُ الرَّاحِمِينَ (٩٢)

May Allah forgive you; and He is the Most Merciful of the merciful. (Surah Yusuf: 92)

Dua 4

رَحْمَتُ اللَّهِ وَبَرَكَاتُهُ عَلَيْكُمْ أَهْلَ الْبَيْتِ إِنَّهُ حَمِيدٌ مَجِيدٌ (٧٣)

Mercy of Allah and His blessings be upon you, people of the house, verily He is Praiseworthy, Glorious. (Surah Hood: 73)

Dua 5

رَبِّ اغْفِرْ لِي وَلِوَالِدَيَّ وَلِمَنْ دَخَلَ بَيْتِي مُؤْمِنًا وَلِلْمُؤْمِنِينَ وَالْمُؤْمِنَاتِ وَلَا تَزِدِ الظَّالِمِينَ إِلَّا تَبَارًا (٢٨)

"O my Lord! Forgive me, my parents, all who enter my house in Faith, and (all) believing men and believing women. (Surah Nooh: 28)

Dua 6

رَبَّنَا اغْفِرْ لِي وَلِوَالِدَيَّ وَلِلْمُؤْمِنِينَ يَوْمَ يَقُومُ الْحِسَابُ (٤١)

Our Lord! forgive me and my parents and all the believers on the Day when the reckoning will be established. (Surah Ibrahim: 41)

Fatima Bint Muhammad (R)

- Youngest daughter of the Messenger of Allah (S).
- Was born 5 years before Muhammad (S) became a Prophet.
- 'Syedat-un-Nisa', 'Fatima-tuz-Zahra', 'Umm al-Hasanayn', 'Al-Batool', 'Umm Abeeha'.
- Among the four best women in the world.
- Had a beaming face which seemed to radiate light.
- Fine manners, generous, chaste, devout.
- Spent most of her time in acts of worship.
- Epitome of Sabr, Shukr & endurance.
- Resembled Rasool-Allah (S) in speech.
- Rasool-Allah (S)'s gesture for her daughter.
- Incident at Kaaba.
- Affinity with father.
- Got married to Ali bin Abi Talib in 2nd year after Hijrah.
- Lived a simple and frugal life.

- Did all household tasks by herself.
- Children: Hassan, Hussain, Zainab, Umm Kulthum, Ruqayya and Muhsin.
- Last moments with Rasool-Allah(S).
- 5 months after his death, she passed away in Ramadan at 29 years of age.
- It was her desire and will to be buried at night, so that her body is not visible to all!
- Narrator of 18 Ahadiths.

Sister

Rights of a sister:

- To be treated with justice in all dealings.
- To be advised.

Dua for siblings

رَبِّ اغْفِرْ لِي وَلِإِخِي وَأَدْخِلْنَا فِي رَحْمَتِكَ وَأَنْتَ أَرْحَمُ الرَّاحِمِينَ (١٥١)

O my Lord! Forgive me and my brother, and admit us into Your Mercy, for you are the Most Merciful of those who show mercy. ([Surah Aaraf: 151](#))

Responsibilities of a sister:

- Never misuse your influence.
- Maintain secrets between siblings.
- Pray for them in their absence.
- Enjoin good and forbid evil.
- Have a self-less attitude.

- Avoid arguments and quarrels.
- Do not backbite.
- Increase tolerance.
- Show respect to elder as well as younger ones.
- Never envy or compare.
- Always uphold ties.
- Love for them what you love for yourself.

♥TIPS

- ♥ Give gifts regularly to each other.

The Prophet (S) said: "Exchange gifts, you will love one another."

(Bukhari).

Fatima Bint Khattab (R)

- Sister of Omar Bin Khattab (R).
- Wife of Saeed Bin Zaid (R).
- One of the early followers of Islam.
- Omar embraces Islam.
- Her role as a sister.

Rights of a wife:

- To get Meher.
- To be supported and be treated kindly and properly.
- Not to be beaten or abused — physically or emotionally.
- To have privacy.
- Defense of honor.
- To be consulted.
- To be provided financially.
- To earn if she wants.
- Right to visit parents.
- Justice between multiple wives.
- To demand separation (Khula).

Responsibilities of a wife:

- Obey your husband (except disobedience to Allah).
- Consider him and accept him as the head of the household.
- Not do anything against his permission.
- Protect and take care of his property and children.
- Compromise when needed.
- Make sure that your husband is pleased and satisfied with you in every aspect of your life!
- You have a right to be treated with respect, but you have the responsibility to treat your partner with respect too.
- Do not to be rude, disrespectful, or dishonoring to him.
- Stay within the means.
- Make your home an abode of love and peace.

♥TIPS

- ♥Read the Seerah of Khadija (R) – very strongly recommended.
- ♥Do not exert power or control in relationships.
- ♥Give partner space to enjoy life outside of this relationship.

Dua for spouse

رَبَّنَا هَبْ لَنَا مِنْ أَزْوَاجِنَا وَذُرِّيَّاتِنَا قُرَّةَ أَعْيُنٍ وَاجْعَلْنَا لِلْمُتَّقِينَ إِمَامًا (٧٤)

Our Lord! Grant unto us wives and offspring who will be the comfort of our eyes and give us (the grace) to lead the righteous. (Surah Furqan: 74)

Khadija Bint Khuwailid (R)

- First Muslim.
- Was born to Khuwailid bin Asad and Fatima bint Zaid in Makkah.
- Most respectable woman of Quraish.
- Tahera, Ameera-tul-Quraish, Queen of Makkah, Khadija Al-Kubra, Siddiqua, Akmal-ul-Momineen.
- Among the four best women in the world.
- Was given the glad tidings of having a palace in Paradise.
- Was blessed with the distinction of having been greeted with Salam (greetings) by Allah and Jibrael (a.s).
- Loyal, intelligent, sympathetic, dedicated.
- Ideal wife and mother.
- Epitome of moral support & sacrifice.
- Widowed twice.

- Inspired by Muhammad (S)'s integrity & honesty, she hired him as her employee.
- Sent him a proposal.
- Children: Qasim, Abdullah, Zainab, Ruqayyah, Umm Kulthum and Fatima.
- Carried food for Rasool Allah (S) to Cave of Hira alone.
- The incident of first revelation.
- Passed away at the age of sixty-five.
- Rasool Allah (S) spent 25 years with her.

Mother

Rights of a mother:

- To be treated with love and respect.
- To be obeyed.
- She is the most deserving of people of her child's good companionship.
- To be taken care of.
- Spending on her if she is in need.
- After one's mother dies, it is Sunnah to fulfill any vows that she had made, and to give charity and perform Hajj and Umrah on her behalf.
- After she dies, it is also Sunnah to honour her by maintaining ties with those whom she used to keep in touch with, such as her relatives and friends.

Responsibilities of a mother:

- It is the primary responsibility of a woman to look after her children. Rest all is secondary.
- Islam didn't give the responsibility of earning to women, so that she can focus on the upbringing of her children.
- She is responsible to bring up children in a righteous manner and to treat all children equally and fairly.
- She has to be a good role model for her children.
- Children usually follow their mother's religion .
- The great Sahaabas and scholars of Islam were great because of the great ways in which they were brought up by their mothers.
- A mother has the power to bring revolution.
- ♥ Talk openly and discuss about biddah issues with your kids.

Safiya Bint Abdul Muttalib (R)

- Daughter of Abdul Muttalib.
- Paternal aunt of Muhammad (S).
- Poetess.
- Her first husband was Harith, brother of Abu Sufyan.
- Her second husband was Awwam bin Khuwailid who was Khadija (R)'s brother.
- Her son was Zubair bin Awwam (R).
- Epitome of strength.
- Her strong character was witnessed.
- Her bravery was witnessed.

Miscellaneous

Daughter in law

- Has the right to privacy.
- Has the right to be treated with respect.
- Has no Islamic obligation to serve or take care of her husband's family. But if she does, that is mustahab (highly recommended) and liked in Islam, and it is also kindness towards her husband.
- If a believing woman, of her own free will, serves the parents or family of her husband, she would be doing a deed of ehsaan, a deed which would be over and above her prescribed duties and responsibilities.

In-laws

- Maintaining good relations with them will increase your bond with your husband.
- Never make an issue about "me or them".
- Your husband has to honour his parents, and you should help him in that.
- Expect some adjustment time after marriage to adjust to this new relationship.
- Seek from their experiences.
- Hold your tongue.
- Be empathetic.
- Accept when you are wrong and apologise.
- Strengthen your childrens' bond with them.
- Keep in touch with them.
- Do not go to your parents with your quarrels.
- Do not divulge their secrets.

-Be forgiving and keep your sense of humor.

-Always treat your in-laws with compassion, respect and mercy.

Friend

- Do not display your awrah to other women.
- Love them for the sake of Allah.
- Never betray trust.
- Always be there in times of need.
- Be supportive.
- Listen attentively.
- Be considerate.
- Give them time.
- Do not spread lies about them.
- Help them to obey Allah.
- Keep righteous friends.
- Respect their values but stick to your moral principles.
- Be a part of their joys and sorrows.
- Make efforts to know what is going on in their lives.

Da'ee

- Patience.
- Softness, body language, expressions, gestures are very important.
- Never ever correct your elders.
- Do not argue.
- Address the person according to his level of understanding.
- Know what you are talking about.
- Use your talents and blessings to call people towards Islam.
- When you spread the word of Allah among people, try to establish a better connection of yourself with Allah first.
- Learn to ignore.
- Renew your intentions, which should be only to please Allah.

Tips to become a better Muslimah

- Fear Allah.
- Never get influenced by other cultures. Be proud of your Deen.
- Enjoin good and forbid evil to the best of one's ability.
- Have steadfast faith in Allah.
- Seek correct knowledge.
- Stay away from fictions, unproductive entertainment.
- Mostly innovative practices (Biddahs) are started and practiced by women! Be cautious.
- Refrain from showing off.
- Be patient during illness and in times of hardship.
- Always try to reconcile between Muslims.
- Visit the sick.
- Never take back gifts.

- Be consistently considerate.
- Show interest in the interests of others.
- Don't embarrass by correcting someone in front of others.
- Satisfy the halal needs of people.
- Help those in need.
- Don't wait to assist the needy until they ask you.
- Always be fair, just and honest.
- Give others sincere respect and heighten their self-esteem.
- Be simple, moderate, and respectful.
- Avoid embarrassing comments.
- Be cheerful and enthusiastic.
- Monitor yourself when you are feeling humorous.
- Be always the one who initiates greetings.
- Stay away from any kind of lottery, palm reading, astrology, zodiac signs.
- Never harm yourself.

- Stay away from all the things that would invite the Shayateen.
- Accept your Mahram men as your in-charge in all matters whole heartedly.
- Value relationships over time, money and recreation.
- Be punctual. Respect the time of others.
- Learn all skills.
- Maintain good hygiene.
- Be a Charity queen.
- Do not be a picky eater.
- Recognise your passions.
